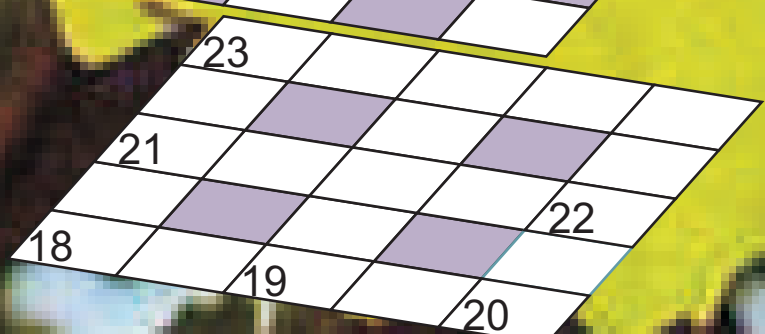
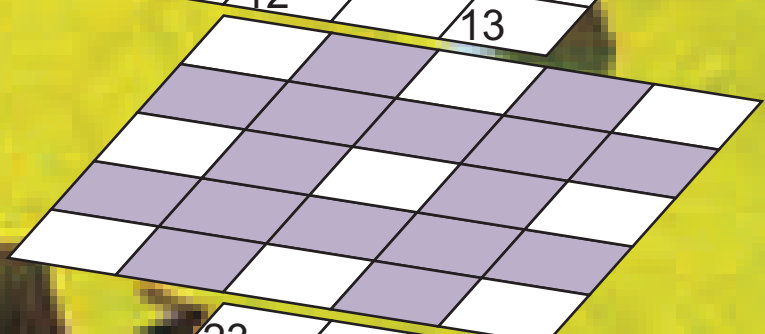
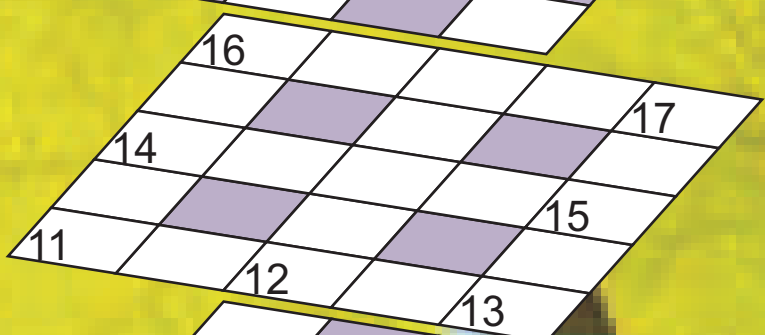
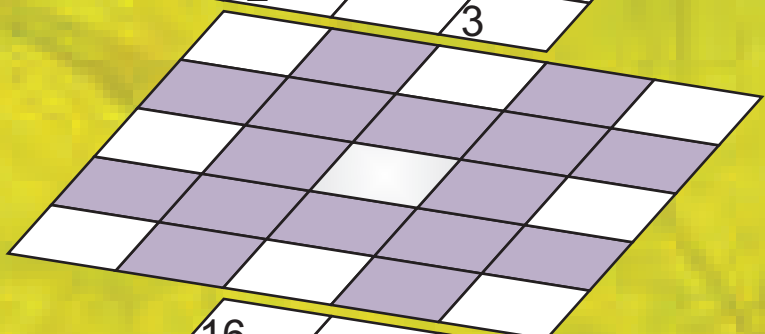
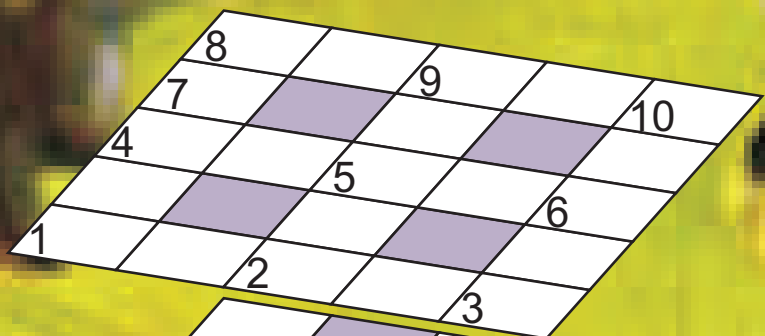


# Extra March 2011 Trailman

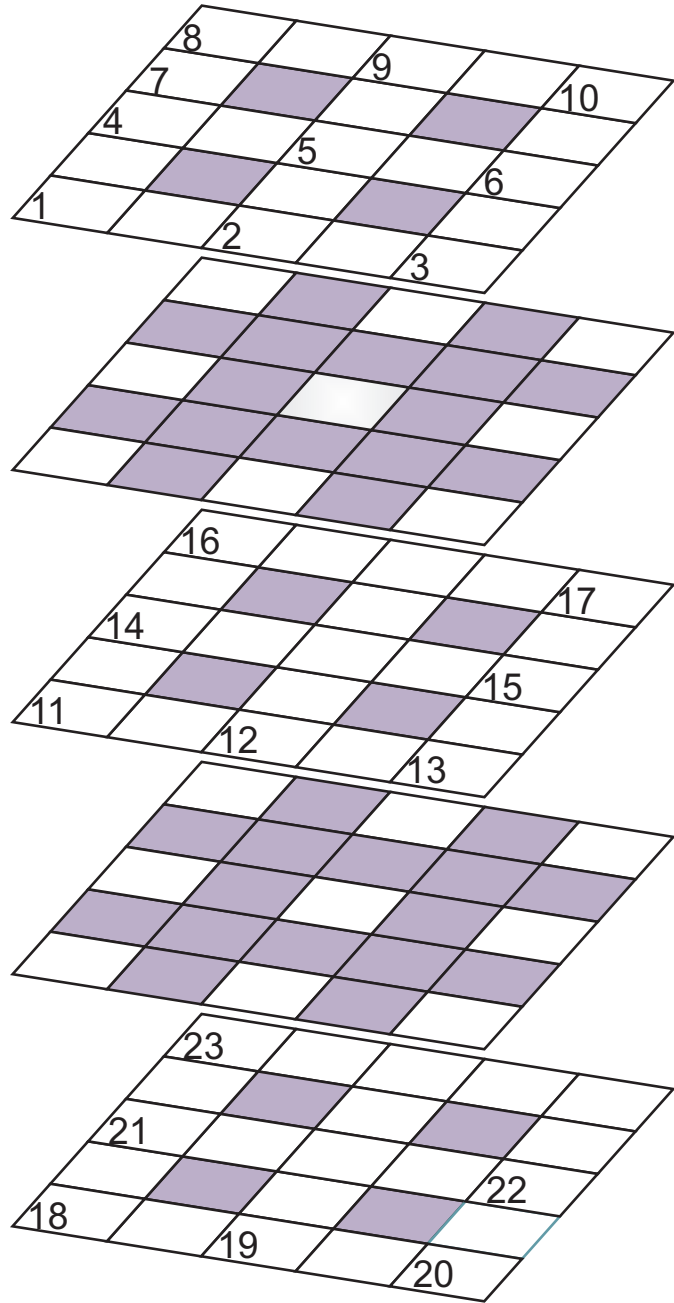

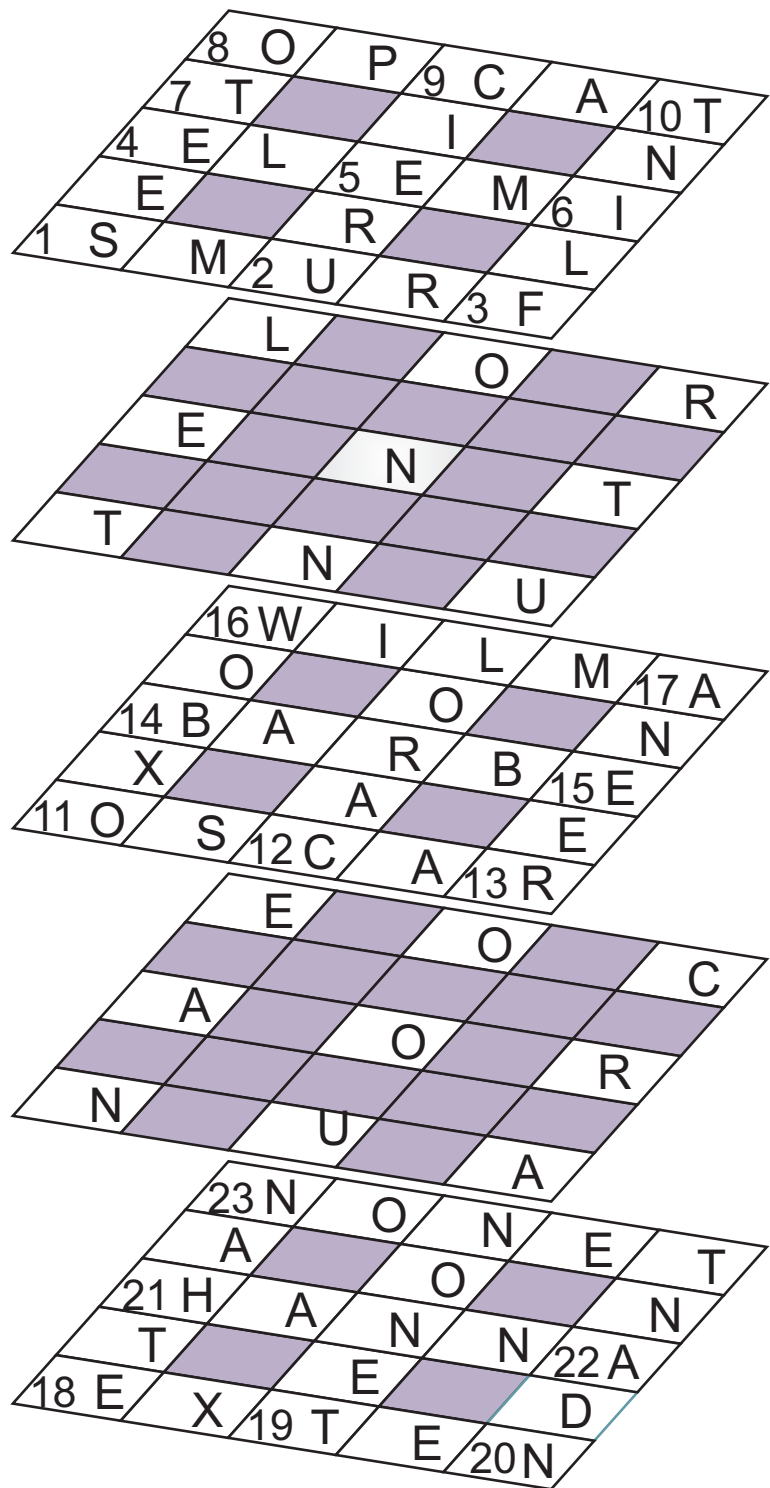
